

Trinity Lutheran's 146<sup>th</sup> annual meeting was held on January 21<sup>st</sup>, 2024. We had 54 voting members in attendance. In addition to the usual business of accepting various reports and approving a 2024 budget, we elected three new people to the church council. I want to welcome Annette Hansen, Linda Olson and Leland Johnson to 3 year terms. I am very grateful for retiring members Jeff Nelson and Steve Olson for their six faithful years of service to Trinity. Thank you!

Pastor Eileen and Jean Pestorious gave an update on the Shared Ministry agreement with First Lutheran Church of Glenville. Steve Olson also gave a report regarding the 2024 South Tower repair project. At this point in time we are not sure what the total estimated cost will be. The 2023 Financial, 2024 Budget and the Annual reports are available from the office.

We were disappointed that MN Adult/Teen Challenge was not able to join us on January 14<sup>th</sup> because of the extremely cold weather. However, we will be looking for an alternative date if possible. All donations will be forwarded to them.

A new program that was initiated in 2023 at Trinity was the "Noisy Offering" collection on the third Sunday of each month. The three organizations that benefit are the Salvation Army Food Pantry, the Ecumenical Food Shelf and the United Way Welcome Pantry. In the 9 months of giving, over \$1500 has been collected. Save your change and bring it to Trinity.

One of the organizations we support with our benevolence dollars is Children's Vision International, Inc. in Bogota, Columbia. CVII was formed 30 years ago, and some members from Trinity travelled there to help establish it. A thank you letter with more information from CVII is posted on the bulletin board by the office.

It doesn't seem possible that the Lenten season is almost upon us. I am looking forward to seeing you in church.

Writing this, we just completed the 146<sup>th</sup> Trinity annual meeting, 54 were in attendance. I presented the 2024 budget, and it was approved by the meeting attendees. Thank you to those who completed their council service and welcome to our new members. Del Johnson was nominated for Vice-President and accepted the position. Congratulations and thank you for accepting. Now for a recap of numbers from my yearly report.

Trinity had a cushion of \$1,009 for meeting our fixed expenses and salaries in 2023. Our total disbursements were up \$9,753 from 2022. Our total offering increased by \$10,762 from 2022. We met or exceeded **all** our designated benevolences we budgeted for in 2023. For the first time while serving on the finance committee or as Treasurer, we fully met the budgeted amount of \$10,000 to the ELCA. Our committee was very happy to meet that benevolence and it was because of all our generous donors.

The finance committee decided to move \$10,000 from our general fund to the following restricted funds, South Tower repair and Parking Lot as those projects will be upon us, the South Tower project being the most urgent of the two – each account received \$5,000.

Lent begins on February 14th with Ash Wednesday (Also Valentine's Day). On Ash Wednesday we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter with a day of fasting and repentance. Marking our foreheads with dust, we acknowledge that we die and return to the earth. At the same time, the dust traces the life-giving cross indelibly marked on our foreheads at baptism. While we journey through Lent to return to God, we have already been reconciled to God through Christ. We humbly pray for God to make our hearts clean while we rejoice that "now is the day of salvation." Returning to our baptismal call, we more intentionally bear the fruits of mercy and justice in the world.

But what is Lent?

Lent is the 40 days before Easter (not including Sundays) that we remember Jesus'

sacrifice for our sin and journey with him to the cross. The liturgical color of the season is purple to remind us of the majesty and royalty of Jesus the Savior of the world. Lent is a penitential season. This means that we look inside to ways that we have harmed our relationships with God and others, ask forgiveness, and work to live our lives in a more holy way. Our worship is stark. The music will be in minor tones. We will not use the word Alleluia again—a word of great praise—until we will celebrate the Resurrected Lord on Easter.

I don't know why, but Lent has always been one of my favorite seasons in the church year. I like the contrast in worship. I've been a church nerd from way back. I love attending worship more often with Wednesday Lenten services. Along with the Wednesday services, there is always a soup dinner. It's not that I terribly love soup; I love the fellowship, the family of God eating a meal together every week. As an only child, I cherished and still cherish these times.

When I was a kid, my pastor would always suggest that we fast for Lent. This meant that we would give something up for Lent as an example of all the things that Jesus gave up for us. It seemed that every year I would give up French fries. French fries were a staple to a junior high and high school students' lunch. So, it wasn't a totally easy thing to do; but I don't think giving up French fries is really equal to what Jesus did for me and for you.

As I grew older, I decided to start adding something to my devotional time during Lent—
to be more intentional in my "time with God." I think this was more useful than my lack of French fries. It helped build my relationship with God and therefore with each other.

I continue to do this. I wonder what else we could do. Perhaps we could change our relationships with God and others by Random Acts of Kindness in Jesus' Name: more smiles, more door opening, more please and thank you, more...

In fact, for this Lent, my family and I are going to fill a Lent bag. Each day we will put something in the Lent bag. It could be an article of clothing we don't wear any more. It could be a toy that has been long forgotten. It could be a book that's been read. It could be a can of vegetables. It could be many things. Or maybe it will be something that we don't need any more and no one else needs it either (like something broken) that is just taking up space and needs to go away and out of our lives. When Lent is over, hopefully our lives will be less filled with junk and more filled with God's love.

I invite you this Lenten season...fill up your Lenten bag.

# Ash Wednesday: Cross Purposes Sunday Lenten Theme

#### Ash Wednesday: Cross Examine

In our worship this Lent we recognize and reflect upon God's purposes as we stand at the foot of the cross. On Ash Wednesday we examine ourselves in the light of the cross. Though our sins make us guilty, we are found not guilty, through the death of the innocent Son of god.

#### Week 1: Cross Out

In this service for Week 1 in Lent we remember that all our sins have been crossed out through the forgiveness that comes only through the atoning sacrifice of the crucified Christ.

#### Week 2: Cross Road

In this service for Week 2 in Lent we remember that heaven crossed the path of earth on Mount Calvary, becoming a cross road for us that changed the direction of our lives forever.

#### Week 3: Cross Walk

In this service for Week 3 in Lent we remember that we are called to follow Christ on his cross walk, stepping out into a life of suffering and service in the name of the Lord.

#### Week 4: Cross Word

In this service for Week 4 in Lent we remember that the promise, the message, the word of the cross, is an all-powerful, and that power is made perfect in weakness.

## Week 5: Cross Reference

In this service for Week 4 in Lent we remember that the cross of Christ was referenced long ago by the prophets and refers us now to the future glory we will experience in heaven with him.

In our sanctuaries, we will have a **roughhewn cross.** For the season of Lent, you are invited to tie a prayer cloth to the cross. What does this mean? By the cross there will be strips of cloth. During worship as we sing our hymns or when you come up for Holy Communion or sometime during the week, come to the cross. Say a prayer. And tie your prayer to the cross. Your prayer can be for you, for a loved one, for the world, or anything you want to share with God. All are invited to come to the prayer cross.

We are excited that First Lutheran from Glenville will be joining us and also participating in our Lenten service. We should wear name tags! Soup and dessert makers are also needed for our Lenten Suppers.
