





# **Finance**

The June/July newsletter is here. Congratulations to our 4 students that graduated high school this year!! I would also like to congratulate the outgoing confirmation class on their completion of studies in faith.

Did you know that there is a Trinity Lutheran Endowment Fund? This is a permanent fund that was established from bequests and donations to Trinity. The principal money is left intact, but the quarterly interest is credited to our Mission Trust, Family Faith Formation, and graduating senior scholarship accounts. This money is invested in the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA and has a value of over \$240,000. The 4 fixed certificates of deposit have varying maturity lengths and interest rates. Please contact the finance committee if you are interested in learning more about how to leave a legacy gift to Trinity Lutheran.

The higher fixed interest rates have also given us the opportunity to invest a portion of our restricted fund account locally in multiple, short-term CDs. This increase in interest money will be used to enhance our ministry at Trinity. We will continue to monitor current economic conditions for low-risk investment opportunities.



The 2023 Southeastern MN Synod Assembly was held May 6<sup>th</sup> in Mankato. This year's theme was "Flourish – Like trees planted by streams of water." We are all connected and depend on each other to share the ministry. Pastor Eileen, Cathy Petersen, Greg Andersen and myself attended from Trinity. The assembly began with worship and communion. Bishop Hassanally had a very thought provoking and entertaining message. One of the guest speakers was the Minnesota State Demographer, Dr. Susan Brower. She spoke about current and projected population trends in Minnesota. These are changing not only because of age, but also because of the many diverse populations moving to Minnesota. We are experiencing that in Albert Lea and our Trinity congregation.

Bishop Hassanally, in her pre-assembly message "Learning from the Forest," reminds us that "we each have a role in the ministry of the whole synod as individuals and congregations. Each congregation's ministry can be fortified and strengthened by the ministry and presence of the congregations around it....We each need a deep taproot, something solid and solitary, rooted in Christ and our communities. We each need a lateral root system, too. This fibrous outreach to other individuals, communities, and congregations connects us to one another." This is a good reminder of where does Trinity Lutheran and each one of us fit in our own ministry of Christ to those around us.
