

The Book of Esther, in the Old Testament, tells the story of Esther, a young Jewish woman who becomes queen of Persia and saves her people from genocide. The story Israelites are in exile in Babylon. Esther and her cousin Mordecai persuade the king to retract an order for the general annihilation of Jews, but the king's chief minister Haman has other plans. Esther reveals her identity to save her people, and the two work together to reverse the decree. The day the Jewish people are to be killed, Mordecai issues a counter-decree that allows them to defend themselves. Jewish people celebrate the new decree with feasts and banquets, and Mordecai is elevated to a seat beside the king. The Book of Esther is a classic story of good versus evil that explores themes of preserving Jewish identity and survival in a foreign land. It's celebrated by Jewish people every year on the holiday of Purim.

It's a really good book in the Bible. If you haven't read it, you should.

In Esther, Queen Esther is not sure if she should use her royal power to save her people. Sharing with the king her true identity could result in her own demise and death. Mordecai, however, implores his cousin Esther, "Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just such a time as this" (Esther 4:14b).

I believe that God is saying this to our congregations, "Who knows? Perhaps you have come Trinity and First for just such a time as this."

Could God say the same thing to each of us, "Who knows? Perhaps you have come, [your name] for just such a time as this."?

Yes.

Trinity, Albert Lea and First, Glenville have completed their first 6 month partnership. I feel that the partnership has gone very well. The change in worship times has gone smoothly. Trinity might have a few folks who come in late, but that only happens once in a while. Our worship is richer together.

Our Confirmation ministry has blossomed. Believe it or not, we had 22 students at the beginning. We have had some move or decide not to complete the program.

We now have 18! When we have more kids, we can do more learning. Plus I think it's more fun. They have enjoyed learning and playing. We celebrate with two of our young ladies Affirming their Baptisms this month at First.

We have done Holy Communion Education. On the Friday before Palm Sunday, students and their parents gathered to learn about the awesome gift of Holy Communion. I pray that wonderful, loving memories have been made.

I had a blast during Lent. It was so comforting to worship, eat, and fellowship together in one place. Worship was meaningful. The food was awesome! All the people who helped make the Wednesday Lenten worship happen were fantastic! We met each other and learned that folks from Trinity and First are a lot alike. In fact, many of us already knew each other.

Lent culminated with a Maundy Thursday Worship at First that encompassed the true meaning of Maundy Thursday (the institution of the Last Supper and the Great Commandment). Then Good Friday saw our confirmation students and mentors share the Passion of Christ.

I have been asked how I am doing with the change. To be honest, there is more work to be done. However, the newness has given me a renewed energy and excitement. I thrive being busy, and there have been some times when I have.

The councils of First and Trinity have decided to continue with our partnership. The current partnership will go until September 1st. At that time, I predict that we will make another yearly commitment.

So, how do I see us moving on? What would I like us to work on in the next 5 months?

I would like to continue working on the ministries that we can do together—confirmation, faith stepping stones, Bible study, service, etc. I would like us to keep on having vibrant worship. I would like that, even though we are two separate congregations, we see our purpose as the same – To Love God and Love Others as we Serve God and Serve Others.

I am sure there is much more that we can and will do. Let us pray for the Holy Spirit to guide us and lead us for such a time as this.
