# **Premises Committee November 2023**

- The carpets in the Sanctuary, the stairs and Entrance areas, the altar area, the stairs to the balcony, and the balcony were all steam cleaned. In other words, all the red carpets were steam cleaned. I think it really brightened up the church. It's been a while since they were cleaned last.
- The Trinity Hall carpet looks great since it was cleaned. It survived the soup and pie supper with minimum spilling.
- Several years ago, we did some extensive repairs on the bell tower. We installed a new roof and re-plastered the ceilings below in the balcony area. With our roof inspection in the past summer, we found that the south tower needs repair. It looks like we need a new roof for sure and possible roof construction replacement of some rotten floor joists. We have a construction engineer coming to look at and tell us what we need to do for repairs. Hopefully we can do this repair before winter sets in.
- The boilers have been started so all zone valves and boiler safeties can be checked for operation, and the forced air furnaces can be checked for proper operation before the cold weather sets in.
- Soon the church will be decorated for Christmas.
   It will be here before we know it.

Thank you for your generous support over the past year! Last year, our shortfall through September 2022 was \$21,157. This year, through September, we only had a shortfall of \$8,047. That is an increase of \$13,110, the finance committee is very appreciative of the rise in donations to Trinity and our mission.

On October 5<sup>th</sup> I sold tickets for the TLCW annual soup & pie fundraiser (11AM-1PM, not the evening serving). Selling tickets was the small part I helped with. The volunteers setting up, cooking, and cleaning up really knocked it out of the park. I am always in awe of how well things run and get done in Trinity Hall with our volunteers. 
