Dear Friends at Trintiy:

Peaceful greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus!

My Sweet Sonya's death (25 June) was quite swift and unexpected. She was diagnosed with malignant multiple myeloma and we had been told that "though not curable, it is treatable and manageable and people can have an active and productive life for many, many years." We had started a discipline of both radiation and chemo treatments and were settling into what we thought would be something of a routine for months and years to come. It was not to be, however, and the end came all too swiftly. I am left utterly devastated and I am trying to deal with the harsh reality that death deals to those left behind.

What has upheld me in this dark time is the promise of our Savior and the sure hope of resurrection and glad and happy reunion with those we love in an eternal realm. What has also supported me in this time is the rock solid love and tender care of family and friends. I am writing to you because you have been an important and significant part of our lives throughout our nearly 53 years together; and our now-50+ years of pastoral ministry. I say "our" because I certainly could not have done this without Sonya and also because she was such an important part of our time together with you.

So many cards, letters, notes of remembrances, assurance of prayers and good wishes! Also, such generosity! Many of you have sent memorials in remembrance and honor of Sonya. Sonya's wishes for memorials to go to the Trinity Lutheran Church (Gresham, OR) Endowment Fund (which provides for ministry and outreach resources in perpetuity) has been honored. Other gifts to a special fund for support of an inner-city school (Portland, OR) for families who cannot afford school supplies for their child was also a special interest for Sonya. Some of you have made other designated gifts and those wishes have also been honored. For your kindness and generosity, my family and I say, Thank You!

Danke! Merci! Gracias! Shukran! Thank You! Thank You! Thank You!

A memorial folder from the funeral service (1 July) is enclosed. It was a joyful and hope-filled liturgy centered in the resurrection of our Lord and a beautiful musical tribute to our beautiful Sonya and her deep love and appreciation for the music arts which was so much a part of her and her ministry. 
Premises Committee October 2023



The Soup 'n Pie committee are so blessed by all of our willing workers and bakers. I am writing this before "lefse making day", I am sure it will be a great success also.






