Message from Pastor Eileen

Reformation Sunday—WEAR RED!!!

Life can get messy. Feelings can be hurt. Seasons change. Friendships grow and wane. The way we've always done it isn't sustainable anymore. When life gets messy, the one thing that we can always depend on is God's love for you and me.

I am really excited for our Fall Monday bible study. We are looking at "Messy People: Life Lessons from Imperfect Biblical Heroes" by Jennifer Cowart. If each of us looks closely at our lives, we would all see that our lives are messy in one way or the other, but God can take our mess and make it into something special.

The "messy" people we will be looking at are: Rahab: Changing Your Messy Story (Joshua 2:6) ...the prostitute that helped Joshua bring down Jericho, The Prodigal Son: Restoring Messy Relationships (Luke 15: 11-32) ...the son that messed up big time but continues to be loved by his father, Josiah: Breaking Messy Family Cycles (2 Kings 22-23; 2 Chronicles 34-35) ...the king who remembered how God wants God's people to live, Mary: Surviving Life's Messy Plot Twists (Luke 1: 26-38) ...the young mother of our Savior, David: Overcoming the Mess of Criticism (1 Samuel 16-18; 2 Samuel 12;15) ...God's favorite king with a lot of baggage, and Daniel: Thriving in Messy Circumstances ...how to live as God people in a world that seems so foreign to God's love.

If you can't make the bible study, I invite you to look at these "messy" bible people and learn about their lives. Look at how God uses them even in their messiness. Some of the messiness is brought on by decisions made. Other messiness is just life or the luck of the draw. In any situation, God can bring beauty out of chaos.

What can God do in and with your messiness? Let's be honest with ourselves. We all have some sort of messiness or chaos in our lives. What can God do in your messiness? How can God make you a new creation in the midst of your messiness? Is God calling you to something new? Is God calling you away from something that is hurtful?

I ask you to pray this month for God to take our messiness... yours, mine, and the world...and make something new and beautiful. Oh, God may our messiness give glory to you. And may we be kind to each other as we work through the messiness of life.




